

I would like to welcome you and your child to an extremely fun-filled and exciting kindergarten classroom where dreamers are born, letters come alive, and the love for learning never dies. I have been looking forward to the first day of kindergarten and can't wait to meet and get to know both you and your child!!! I hope this letter will familiarize you with our kindergarten program and answer some of the questions you may have. (If I were you, I would keep this letter for a little while so you can refer to it if necessary. It is packed full of information.)

Parent/Teacher Communication: I believe that teachers and parents are partners in education. You are an essential part of our kindergarten program- for YOU are your child's FIRST and BEST teacher! We must work together as a team to best benefit the development of your child- academically, physically, socially, and emotionally. It is through our support and encouragement that your child will grow.

Parent-Teacher Conference: We will have one scheduled parent-teacher conference in October, however, if at anytime throughout the school year you feel a conference is needed or you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to call me, text me, or email me anytime. My contact information is on the last page. (On school days I will only be able to get back with you during my planning time (11:35-12:20 p.m.) or after school at 3:05 p.m.)

www.mrsdickensloveskindergarten.weebly.com: A few years ago, I moved into the 21st century by going "GREEN" and built my own class website. All of my newsletters will be posted on this website as well as emailed directly to your inbox. No more killing trees! ⑤ No more lost papers! ⑥ No more uninformed parents! ⑥ Please visit my website at the beginning of each week and click on the "Newsletters" tab. Each newsletter will be packed full of important information that YOU NEED TO KNOW for that week. The more you know, the better you can communicate with your child...and ME! ⑥. You may also enjoy checking out the monthly pictures tab. In fact, the pictures I take today should be up tonight!!! I will not list any names with the pictures. (If you do not want your child's individual pictures on the website, please let me know.) If you do not have a smartphone or your own computer at home, you may use the internet on the computers at the uptown library FOR FREE!!! ⑥

The Folders: Thank you for providing your child with green and red folders. The green folder will be the "go home" folder, and the red folder will be the "stay at school" folder.

The GREEN Folder: Here at SES we expect our students to BE SAFE, BE RESPONSIBLE, and BE RESPECTFUL. Your child can show RESPONSIBILITY by taking home and bringing back his/her green folder EVERY DAY!! Having that green folder every day is a MUST in my classroom. (The importance of the green folder is just like that of the American Express card slogan. "DON'T LEAVE HOME WITHOUT IT!" (D) (D) Your child is to take the green "go home" folder home every night and bring it back to school every morning. This folder will be our (the teacher and the parents') link to communication. I will ask that the children place all of their papers they have completed throughout the day and any notes from me or the school in their green folder to take home and show their parents. I ask that you please do the same as well. If you have any notes, lunch money, permission slips, etc. for me, please have your child put the item(s) in the green folder to transport to school. Then every morning I will ask the children if they have any notes, etc. for me in their folder. If items are placed in the green folder, they are less likely to get lost than if just placed somewhere in one of the compartments in a backpack. (Please set aside some time every evening to let your child "show and tell" about what is in his/her green folder and what he/she did at school that day.)

Special Notes: If your child needs to go home a different way than usual, it is VERY IMPORTANT that you write me a note and put it in your child's green folder. This will alleviate any confusion. If your plans change during the day, please call the school office and they will send me a note. If no written note or phone call is received, your child will be sent home by his or her usual method of transportation. I would also appreciate a note if your child has a doctor appointment during the school day, if you plan to take your child out for lunch, or if you know in advance that your child is going to be absent from school. When taking your child out of school or bringing him/her back, please sign your child in and out at the office. You must also call the office in the morning if your child is sick of if you plan to bring your child in late due to an early scheduled doctor appointment.

Lunch Money: When sending lunch money to add onto your child's "lunch card" (which works like a debit card), please place it in a sealed envelope in your child's green folder and write the following on the outside of the envelope: your child's name, Mrs. Dickens, the date, the amount of money enclosed, and the check number (if you wrote a check). Please tell your child to take the envelope straight to the office when he/she arrives. You can check the balance of your child's lunch account on Skyward. (I eat lunch at school too sometimes, and when I have less than \$5 left in my account, Skyward sends me an email so I know to replenish it. (3)

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures: Students can arrive as early as 7:30. They will go to the cafeteria and sit in a straight line on the floor in front of the chair labeled "Mrs. Dickens". Breakfast will be available if needed. At 7:45, I will meet the children and take them down to our room.

For Dismissal Procedures we have 7 options. Your child will either be a ...

1.Country Bus Rider 2.Preschool Bus Rider 3.Proto-Tykes Bus Rider 4.Dance Bus Rider5.White City Bus Rider 6.Walker 7.Waiter (some teachers say "Car rider")

The definitions for these 7 terms are as follows:

- 1. Country Bus Rider Your child rides our yellow school bus home or to a sitter's house.
- 2. Preschool Bus Rider Your child rides an after school daycare bus to the Sullivan Preschool.
- 3. Proto-Tykes Bus Rider Your child rides an after school daycare bus to Agri Fab.
- 4. Dance Bus Rider— Your child rides an after school daycare bus to the Sullivan Dance Studio
- 5. White City Bus Rider Your child rides the white city bus home or to a sitter's house. (This CIPT (Central Illinois Public Transit) bus will travel ONLY to where the school buses do not. There is a monthly fee of \$20. 1-855-755-2478)
- 6. **Walker** Your child exits the EAST side of SES and either walks home or walks to Main Street to meet up with his/her ride home.
- 7. Waiter Your child waits in the gym for a parent/caretaker to park on the WEST side of SES and walk in to get him/her.

If your child is any kind of Bus Rider or a Walker, he/she will go to a designated line and be supervised by an adult who will get your child to the right destination.

If your child is a Waiter, he/she will walk with a teacher to the gym. There, your child will wait patiently (with supervisors of course ③) until a parent/caretaker walks into the gym to pick him/her up. Once you have your child, you may walk back out to your vehicle and head home. IF YOUR CHILD IS A WAITER, PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE REMEMBER TO ALWAYS HAVE YOUR SPECIAL LIGHT PURPLE PICK UP # IN YOUR HAND WHEN YOU COME TO PICK UP YOUR CHILD. If you can not pick up your child, be sure to give that special light purple # to whoever is going to pick up your child. No one will be allowed to pick up your child without that special light purple #. (This special light purple pick up # was mailed to you. If your child is going to be a Waiter and you did not receive one, call the office and they will make you a new one.)

Show and Tell

Thursday will be our "Show and Tell" day. Every Thursday your child needs to bring an object from home to "show" and "tell" about. Usually I specify exactly what kind of object your child needs to bring. For example, when we study color words, I have the children bring an object that is the color of the week, AND I have them try to WEAR the color of the week on that same Thursday as well. After color words, I will have the kids bring in an object that begins with (or ends with) the Letter of the Week. Sometimes, I might ask them to bring an object related to the unit we are studying. Just read the weekly newsletter to find out. *It is very important that your child bring something each week for Show and Tell. By doing so, your child learns how to stand in front of a large group of people, SMILE ②, look them in the eye, and speak confidently using complete sentences and a loud, clear voice. This is a wonderful skill for ALL ages to learn!



Dear Parents,

Below is an example of how we will be teaching your child to write numbers. I have included the rhymes I like to use when teaching children to write and recognize these numbers. The kids love to say these rhymes, and if they don't recognize the numbers 1-10 yet, the rhymes help them to catch on pretty quickly. Since parents are often asking me to teach them the number rhymes as well, I decided to make a list of them. Please keep this paper so you or your child may refer to it as needed. (Watch out!! You just might have some fun learning these rhymes along with your child! Enjoy!)

Straight line, 1 is fine

Around and back on the railroad track - choo choo - that's a 2

Around a tree and around a tree, that makes 3

Down and over and down some more, that makes 4

Down and around, put on a hat - I can make a 5 just like that

Down and a loop, 6 rolls a hoop

Across the sky and down from heaven, that makes 7

Make an S, but don't wait, go straight back up and make an 8

A loop and a line, that makes 9

1 and 0, they are friends, together they make the number 10
